COMPLAINT PURSUANT TO COMMITTEE RULE 15

I. COMPLAINANT

David B. Wheeler, [REDACTED];
[REDACTED]. Complainant is not a Member, officer, or employee of the House.

II. RESPONDENT

Representative Lauren Opal Boebert, Member of the U.S. House of Representatives for the Fourth District of Colorado (previously the Third District of Colorado, 2021–2025).

Current House employee involved: Raven Finegan, District Chief of Staff, Office of Rep. Boebert. Former House employees involved: Clarice Navarro Ratzlaff, former District Director; Jeffrey D. Small, former Chief of Staff.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

1. Complainant David B. Wheeler is a journalist. The allegations herein are based on (a) publicly available official records, including quarterly Statements of Disbursements of the U.S. House of Representatives, disbursement records filed with the Federal Election Commission by Lauren Boebert for Congress (FEC Committee ID C00728238), the Congressional Directory, Colorado state court records, and published news reporting; and (b) on-the-record information provided to Complainant by sources with direct knowledge of the conduct described, including persons identified in Part V below, as reflected in Complainant's contemporaneous notes.
2. At all relevant times, Respondent Rep. Lauren Opal Boebert was a Member of the U.S. House of Representatives representing Colorado's Third (2021–2025) and Fourth (2025–present) Congressional Districts.
3. From on or about January 4, 2021, through on or about January 31, 2025, Clarice Navarro Ratzlaff (also appearing in official records as "Clarice Ratzlaff" and in FEC records as "Clarice Navarro") was employed in Respondent's congressional office as District Director, a position under Respondent's direct supervision. House Statements of Disbursements reflect total compensation to Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff of \$449,391.63 over this period. (Exhibits A, B.)

4. Beginning in or about 2021 and continuing at various times through January 2025, Respondent and Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff engaged in a romantic and sexual relationship while Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff was a House employee under Respondent's supervision.
5. Sexual encounters between Respondent and Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff occurred during official office hours, after hours, and on weekends; in Colorado and outside Colorado; in Respondent's district office in Colorado; in a vehicle for which Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff received mileage reimbursements; and in hotel rooms paid for by Respondent's campaign committee.
6. Public reporting documents joint travel by Respondent and Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff. In late October 2022, Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff accompanied Respondent to Mar-a-Lago in Palm Beach, Florida, for what press reports described as a campaign fundraising visit with former President Trump attended by approximately twenty people; the Colorado Times Recorder published a photograph captioned "Boebert (center) at Mar-A-Lago with Clarice Navarro-Ratzlaff (left) and Maggie Silvers." FEC records of Respondent's campaign committee reflect Palm Beach-area spending in the same window, including a meal at Flanigan's, West Palm Beach (\$222.93, October 26, 2022), event catering at Singer Island (\$4,148.20, October 28, 2022), and lodging at the Courtyard by Marriott, West Palm Beach (\$789.40, October 31, 2022). (Exhibits B, D.)
7. [REDACTED], then the husband of Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff, learned of the relationship between Respondent and his wife, and the marriage ended in divorce.
8. House Statements of Disbursements reflect that Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff's fourth-quarter compensation exceeded her third-quarter baseline in each year of her employment, in amounts consistent with year-end bonuses paid from official funds: approximately \$6,150 (Q4 2021), \$11,500 (Q4 2022), \$8,000 (Q4 2023), and \$5,000 (Q4 2024), totaling approximately \$30,650. (Exhibit B.) These year-end payments were made to Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff by Respondent on account of the personal relationship described above and not solely as compensation commensurate with official duties performed.
9. FEC disbursement records of Lauren Boebert for Congress reflect nine payments to "Clarice Navarro" totaling \$12,169.17 between August 2021 and August 2023, of which eight are described as mileage, travel, or expense reimbursements. The ninth is a payment of \$5,000.00 dated July 8, 2022, described as "Fundraising Consulting." (Exhibit B.)
10. Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff performed no fundraising consulting services corresponding to the July 8, 2022, payment. The payment was made to secure her silence regarding the relationship described above, and its purpose was falsely described in the committee's FEC reports.
11. Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff performed work on Respondent's re-election campaigns during periods in which she was being compensated by the U.S. House of Representatives.

12. Following the end of her House employment, Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff communicated to Respondent that she intended to file an ethics complaint against Respondent. Thereafter, in or about March 2025, a payment of approximately \$200,000 was made to Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff to secure her silence and forestall the threatened complaint. The source of the funds is presently unknown to Complainant. [REDACTED] of approximately \$200,000 into that account in or about March 2025.
13. Raven Finegan was employed in Respondent's congressional office from on or about September 6, 2022, to the present, serving successively as Western Slope Field Representative, Western Colorado Regional Director, District Director, and District Chief of Staff, with total House compensation of \$456,013.93 through June 30, 2026; FEC records additionally reflect \$32,216.64 paid to Ms. Finegan by Respondent's campaign committee for consulting between November 2023 and November 2024. (Exhibit A.) Respondent and Ms. Finegan engaged in a romantic and sexual relationship while Ms. Finegan was a House employee under Respondent's supervision. Publicly posted photographs document their extensive personal association, including joint travel and personal social events. (Exhibit E.)
14. Jeffrey D. Small served as Respondent's Chief of Staff from on or about January 3, 2021, to on or about January 30, 2025, with total House compensation of \$767,892.42; FEC records additionally reflect a \$10,000 payment to Mr. Small from Respondent's campaign committee on January 14, 2025. (Exhibit A.) Respondent and Mr. Small engaged in a sexual relationship during his tenure as her Chief of Staff, while he was a House employee under Respondent's supervision.

IV. VIOLATIONS ALLEGED

COUNT I — House Rule XXIII, clause 18(a)

Respondent, a Member of the House, engaged in sexual relationships with employees of the House who worked under her supervision — Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff, Ms. Finegan, and Mr. Small — in violation of clause 18(a) of Rule XXIII. Consent is not a defense to this rule. (Facts ¶¶ 4–5, 13–14.)

COUNT II — House Rule XXIII, clause 8

Respondent retained and compensated employees, including through year-end bonus payments from official funds, other than in amounts commensurate with the duties actually performed for the House. (Facts ¶¶ 8, 11, 13.)

COUNT III — House Rule XXIII, clause 1

The conduct described herein does not reflect creditably on the House, in violation of clause 1 of Rule XXIII. (Facts ¶¶ 3–14.)

COUNT IV — Misuse of official funds and false certification; 18 U.S.C. §§ 641, 1001, 1343, 1346

Official funds were paid to Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff for reasons other than official services rendered, including bonuses paid on account of a personal relationship; such payments constitute conversion of federal funds and false certification of official payroll, and implicate the wire fraud and honest-services fraud statutes. (Facts ¶¶ 3, 8, 11.)

COUNT V — Personal use of campaign funds and false reporting; 52 U.S.C. §§ 30114, 30104

The \$5,000 payment of July 8, 2022, made to secure silence regarding a personal relationship, constituted conversion of campaign funds to personal use, and its description as "Fundraising Consulting" rendered the committee's FEC reports false or misleading. Campaign payment of hotel rooms used for personal encounters constitutes additional personal use. To the extent the March 2025 payment of approximately \$200,000 originated in whole or in part from campaign funds, it constitutes further personal use and, if unreported or misreported, further reporting violations. (Facts ¶¶ 5–6, 9–10, 12.)

COUNT VI — Congressional Accountability Act; 2 U.S.C. § 1301 et seq.

Supervisor-subordinate sexual relationships of the kind described, together with payments conditioned on silence, implicate the prohibitions on workplace harassment and retaliation applicable to congressional employing offices, for which Members bear personal liability for awards and settlements arising from their own conduct. (Facts ¶¶ 4–14.)

COUNT VII — 18 U.S.C. § 1512

The payment of approximately \$200,000 in or about March 2025, made after Ms. Navarro Ratzlaff communicated her intention to file an ethics complaint, was made with intent to prevent her communication to the Committee on Ethics and to hinder, delay, or prevent an official proceeding, and constitutes witness tampering. The July 8, 2022, payment further evidences the same course of conduct. (Facts ¶¶ 10, 12.)

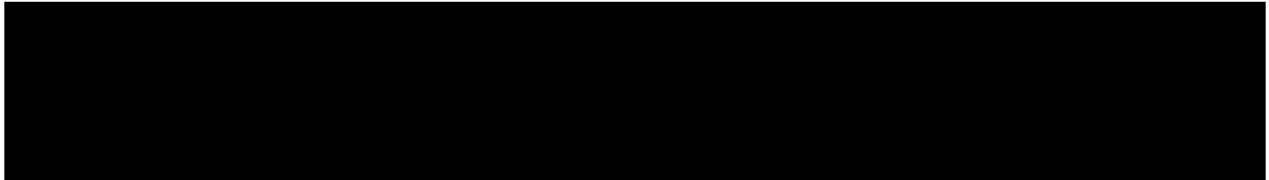

VII. RELIEF REQUESTED

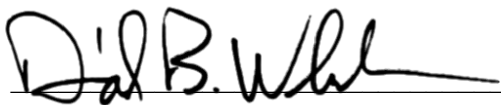

VIII. CERTIFICATION AND VERIFICATION UNDER 28 U.S.C. § 1746

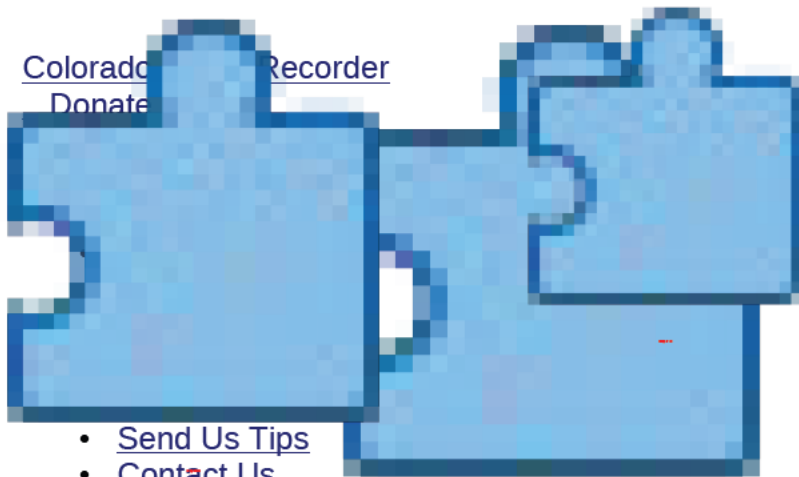

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As Her Race Tightens in CO, Boebert Takes Friends & Family to Mar-A-Lago

With less than two weeks to go before Election Day, most candidates are furiously knocking doors, trying to turn out every last voter they can reach. Colorado Congresswoman Lauren Boebert, who [according to recent polls](#), has a dwindling lead in a race that wasn't expected to be close, flew to Mar-A-Lago with her family and friends for a visit — presumably a fundraiser — with former President Donald Trump.

Colorado Republican National Committeeman Randy Corporon also attended.

“Gorgeous top to bottom,” noted Corporon on Facebook, referring to the Mar-A-Lago compound. “It’s been closed this summer for freshening up, so about twenty of us had it to ourselves along with the owner.”

Former Colorado lawmaker turned USDA official during the Trump administration, Clarice Navarro-Ratzlaff, also joined Boebert in Florida.

This is at least Boebert's fourth Mar-A-Lago fundraiser, following one [back in February](#) of this year as well as [last April](#), when her [entire family came along](#). Last February she and U.S. Rep. Matt Gaetz co-headlined a fundraiser at Trump's resort for Sen. Mike Lee (R-Utah). More recently [Trump called Boebert](#) to congratulate her on her primary win.

Florida isn't the only state the congresswoman has visited this month in her pursuit of campaign cash. Last week she flew to Nashville for a [high-dollar dinner](#) with country singer John Rich.

Boebert, a Republican, has been one of the GOP's most prolific fundraisers, but recent contribution reports show her Democratic opponent closing the gap. Today the Frisch campaign announced raising \$890,000 in the most recent FEC filing, raising more between Oct. 1 and Oct. 19 than Boebert did in the three months of the second quarter when she raised \$849,000. Nearly 14,000 donors gave to Frisch in this time period, including over 9,000 first-time donors.

Reached for comment, Democratic candidate Adam Frisch said Boebert "routinely ignores her district as she jet sets across the country."

"I am disappointed but not surprised to hear that Rep. Boebert is once again at Mar-a-Lago rather than focusing on her constituents here in CO-3," said Frisch. "Voters deserve to hear directly from their elected representatives about the issues that impact their families like inflation, the economy, and the ongoing Colorado River drought. Instead, Boebert routinely ignores her district as she jet sets across the country and avoids holding public town halls. I plan to visit every county in the district between now and Election Day because I believe it is my duty to make myself available to voters to answer their questions and hear their concerns before they decide who to send to Congress.

"Boebert blew off September's Club 20 steak fry in September – which she called a 'fancy dinner' – because she was at a conference in Woodland Park that day. Instead of attending the Pueblo Farm Bureau's candidate forum on September 13th, she was campaigning for Karoline Leavitt in New Hampshire. She also missed an Oct. 18 candidate forum in her hometown of Rifle and Action 22's economic development conference last weekend as she attended a fundraiser in Nashville. I don't see how spending so much time outside of the district rather than attending important community events helps anyone in CO-3."

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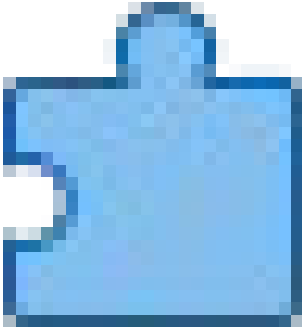
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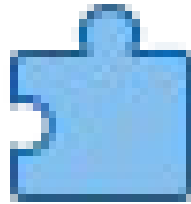
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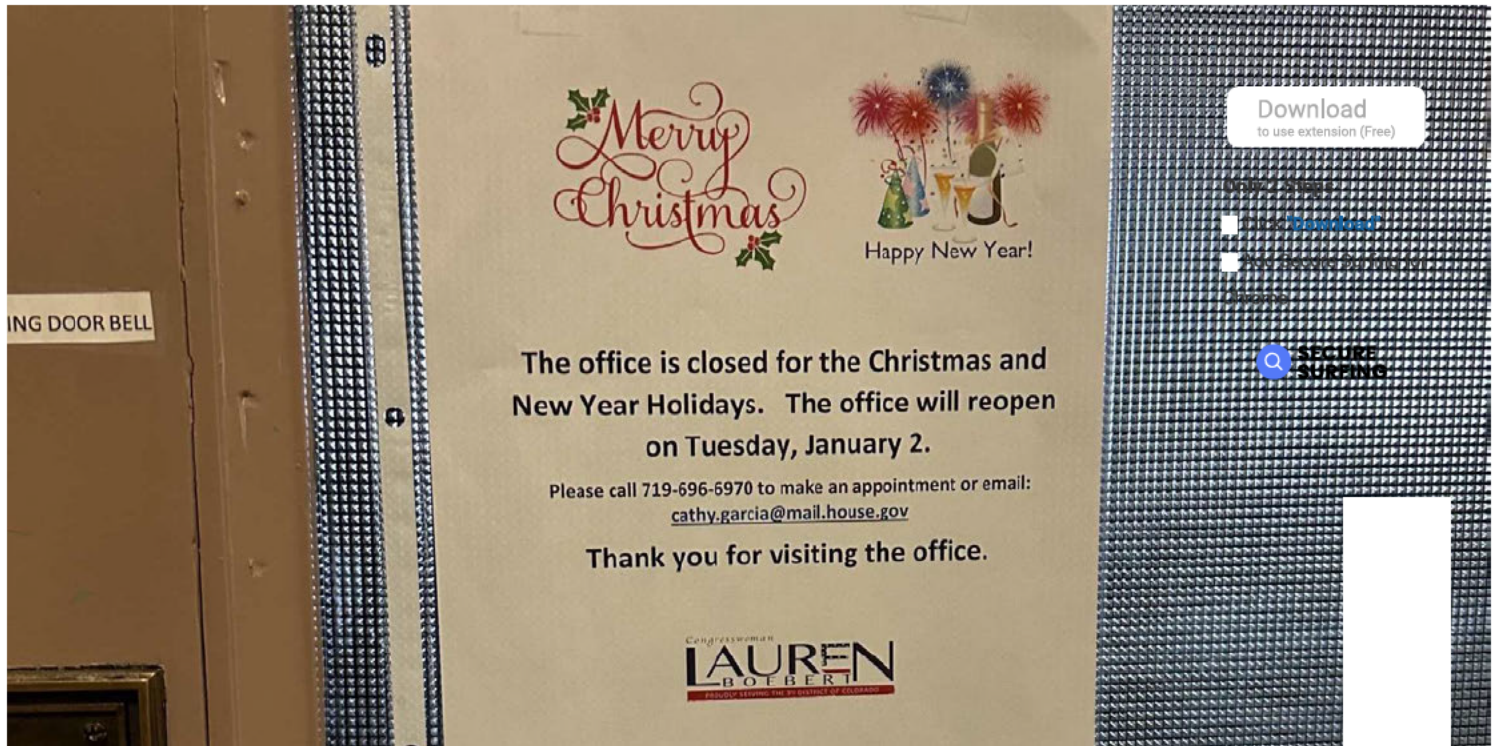

In late November, Rep. Lauren Boebert (R-CO) called Social Security Administration (SSA) staff the equivalent of ne'er-do-well couch-potatoes as she raked a senior Social Security Administration official across the coals during a House Oversight Committee hearing.

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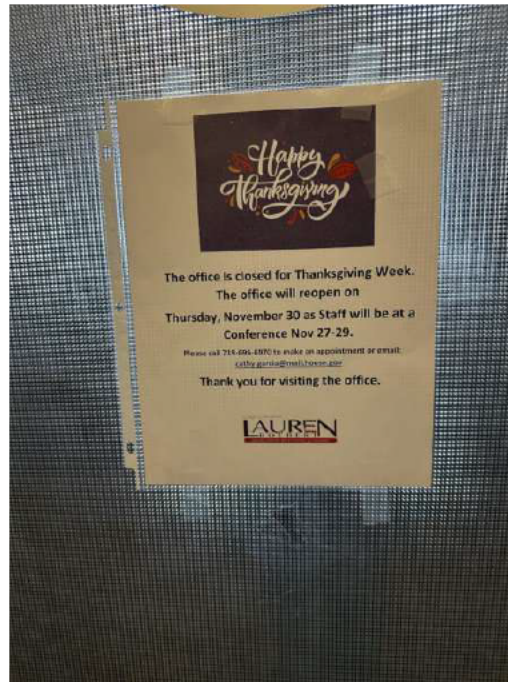
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"Every employee, do you have the numbers of the hours that are submitted, are you counting how many times they're logging into their computers and responding to casework?" Boebert continued.

The SSA has "systems in place" that give managers a real-time overview of what staff are doing at any given time, McNelly replied.

"Additionally," he said, "Our employees are required to be accessible to their supervisors, clients, colleagues, and external parties during work hours through a variety of means including instant messaging, video platforms, and telephone. They are connected to the workplace whether they are in the office or at home."

Boebert's Pueblo Office Closed for 13 Days Around Thanksgiving

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The Pueblo office was closed again Nov. 21, the Tuesday before Thanksgiving, but this time a different reason was offered: the office was shuttered for "Thanksgiving Week."

A new note was taped to the door, wishing the reader a "Happy Thanksgiving" and informing them that the office was going to be closed until Thursday, Nov. 30, because — in addition to the extended Thanksgiving holiday — the staff would be attending a conference from Nov. 27-29.

But on Thursday, Nov. 30, a day after the conference had ended — and the day the office was supposed to reopen — it was still closed. It reopened the following day.

So, in total, Boebert's Pueblo office was closed for 13 days around the Thanksgiving holiday — at least four work days, one day for travelling the district, three days at a conference, one day for Thanksgiving, and four weekend days. It opened Dec. 1.

Ken Buck (R-CO) scheduled to close at noon Friday and U.S. Representatives Doug Lamborn (R-CO) Colorado Springs office and Brittany Pettersen's (D-CO) Lakewood office to close all day Friday. 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Often Working in the Community When Office Is Dark, Says Boebert Staffer

Boebert's district director, Clarice Navarro-Ratzlaff, picked up the office phone when the *Colorado Times Recorder* called on Jan. 10, and said that, when the office is dark, she and her colleagues are often out in the community, working on constituent matters.

She said the "conference" referenced on the Pueblo office's closure in November was a Colorado Counties, Inc. (CCI) meeting. A Google search found that the nonprofit Colorado Counties, Inc. held its winter conference from Nov. 27-29. CCI says on its website that its purpose is to assist county commissioners, mayors, and council members, and encourage counties to work together on common issues.

District Offices' Key Role

Like many other members of Congress, Boebert has several district offices and an office in DC. As of Sept. 30, 2023, she had 17 staff members on the books, including Navarro and Garcia, according to [Legistorm](#).

One of the main responsibilities of a congressional staffer is to provide service to people back in the congressional district. They do this by cutting through bureaucracy to help constituents collect Social Security or other benefits; answering questions about government aid, such as student loans; assisting veterans as they deal with the Veterans Administration; keeping constituents informed of their representative's or senator's activities; and more.

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The salaries of congressional staffers are paid for out of the Members' Representational Allowance (MRA), which can also be used to pay for travel, district office rental, stationery, and other office supplies. MRA funds come from the U.S. Treasury, which gets most of its revenue from taxes, including those paid by individuals.✓

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Other Republicans competing against Boebert in the June 25 CD4 primary election include talk radio host Deborah Flora, former state lawmaker Ted Harvey, state Representatives Richard Holtorf and Mike Lynch, Justin Schreiber, Logan County Commissioner Jerry Sonnenberg, and businessman Peter Yu. The winner of the primary will almost certainly defeat their Democratic opponent in November's general election, as Republicans have a double-digit advantage in the district.
